Living on Mission | November 5, 2023

Summary

Our guest speaker for Worldwide Week, Scott Ridout (COO of The Timothy Initiative), emphasizes the concept of living on mission as a central aspect of a Christian's life. He highlights four choices made by Jesus that serve as a model for living on mission: Jesus went, Jesus felt, Jesus prayed and Jesus sent. As believers, it's important to be part of the church as a movement rather than a physical location. God perfectly positions each of us for His purpose in the world.

Scripture

And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." -Matthew 9:35-38 (ESV)
