The Complaint February 8, 2026

Summary

In this first sermon in the series *Unwavering*, Kyle Robinson introduces the prophet Habakkuk and explores how unwavering faith can exist in the midst of injustice and confusion. Living in a world marked by violence, corruption and misuse of power, Habakkuk brings his complaint honestly before God, asking hard questions about God's apparent silence. Rather than reflecting weak faith, Habakkuk's questions are rooted in God's promises and God's Word. This message shows that genuine, unwavering faith does not avoid difficult questions but brings them directly to the Lord, trusting His character and longing for Him to make what is broken right.

Scripture

The prophecy that Habakkuk the prophet received.

How long, Lord, must I call for help,
but you do not listen?
Or cry out to you, "Violence!"
but you do not save?
Why do you make me look at injustice?
Why do you tolerate wrongdoing?
Destruction and violence are before me;
there is strife, and conflict abounds.
Therefore the law is paralyzed,
and justice never prevails.
The wicked hem in the righteous,
so that justice is perverted. Habakkuk 1:1-4 (NIV)
