Summary

In this sermon, our guest speaker, Walter Kim, explores the powerful vision of God's holiness in Isaiah 6:1-8. In a time of political uncertainty and personal fear, Isaiah encounters the true King—God seated on His throne. Overwhelmed by God's holiness, Isaiah becomes deeply aware of his own sinfulness and need for cleansing. Yet God does not reveal His holiness to destroy Isaiah, but to forgive and restore him. After being cleansed, Isaiah is immediately commissioned to serve: "Here am I. Send me!" The sermon reminds us that encountering God changes us by moving us from fear to worship, from confession to cleansing and from comfort to mission.

Scripture

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. And they were calling to one another:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty;
the whole earth is full of his glory."

At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty."

Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?"
And I said, "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah 6:1-8 (NIV)
