Summary

In his message, Kyle challenges us to consider what we would ask God for if He offered to give us anything we wanted. Ephesians 3:20-21 reminds us that God can do “immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine” because His power is at work within us. God’s Spirit lives in those who follow Jesus and is continually bringing new life and change. Everything God does ultimately brings Him glory through Christ and His Church.

As Wooddale begins a new year studying Ephesians, we are challenged to grow in our love for God, His Church and His glory as we serve and impact our communities. Let’s ask God for more and imagine what He might do in us, through Wooddale and throughout the Twin Cities.

Scripture

Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen. Ephesians 3:20-21 (NIV)

Let’s Talk

1. Kyle asked, “Whatever you would ask God for, have you asked Him?” Is there something you have wanted to ask God for but haven’t? What has held you back?
2. What does “immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine” mean to you? Have you ever seen God do something that was beyond what you expected?
3. The sermon reminds us that the Holy Spirit’s power is already at work within us. Where do you sense God wanting to bring new life or change in you right now?
4. Kyle described three areas where God wants to increase our love: love of God, love of His Church and love of His glory. Which of these three do you most want God to grow in you this year? Why?
5. Kyle challenged us to think about the Church as more than a place that meets our personal needs. What do you think it means to truly love and be committed to the Church?
6. In our last series on spiritual maturity, one of the shifts is to **“live generously.”** What would it look like for you to live more generously with your time, gifts, resources or influence for the sake of God’s Church and His glory?
7. Where do you see opportunities for Wooddale—and for you personally—to have a greater impact in the Twin Cities?

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8. Imagine it is one year from now and God has done “immeasurably more” in your life. What would be different? What are you asking God to do in you this year?
