# Not from Here November 3, 2024

#### Summary

In this sermon, Pastor Kyle explains that while God's Kingdom isn't *of* this world, it is *for* this world, bringing change to our lives and communities. With the election approaching, he encourages Christians to be respectful, involved and wise witnesses in civic life. Pastor Kyle emphasizes respectful dialogue, nonpartisan church involvement and confidence in God's Kingdom, which grows through transformed hearts rather than earthly power. He also interviewed two global partners, Aaron and Julio, about their work sharing the gospel in challenging places.
