Let's Talk

1. What are some thoughts and memories you would like to share about your father?

Let's Dig

1. What is one thing Pastor Dale said that you want to discuss?
2. Read Romans 8:9-11. What are your thoughts and/or questions about the Holy Spirit's work in the life of each Christian?
3. How have you experienced God's presence in your life?
4. Read Exodus 25:8-22. What thoughts and/or questions do you have about the Ark of the Covenant as described in this passage?
5. The ark was the first item in the tabernacle to be built. It had priority! We are to also give priority to Jesus in our lives. How do you do that? Or, in what areas of your life do you need to make some changes so that Jesus is given first priority?
6. The ark contained the 10 commandments, a golden pot containing manna and the rod of Aaron. How do you view God's law....as restrictive or directive? As stealing joy or a means to finding joy?
7. Manna provided strength and health daily for the Israelites in the wilderness. How does the Holy Spirit today provide strength and health for daily living?
8. Read Colossians 2:8-15. This passage describes the work of Jesus. What facet of Jesus' work is most meaningful to you?

Let's Act

1. The tabernacle reminded the Israelites that God was present and powerful. What reminds you of God's presence and power? Remind yourself multiple times each day this week of God's presence and power and see the difference that makes on how you think and act. Discuss together at your next meeting.
