- Read Romans 7:15-20 and discuss wrestling with sins and mistakes.
- How common of an experience is it to feel like Paul did in Romans 7?
- 2. What are some internal/external pressures that lead you to a Romans 7 state of mind?
- Is this message more encouraging, or discouraging for you? Why? (Consider why Paul would be writing this).
- 4. Read verses 21-25. What conclusion does Paul reach? What does that mean for us?

- Read Ezekiel 36:23-27, Colossians 3:1-17 and discuss the idea of starting over.
- 1. When it comes to difficult mistakes, is it possible to next time to be different from last time?
- 2. What needed to happen to the Israelites in Ezekiel 36:26-27 for them to start over?
- 3. Ultimately, where do we gain our strength for starting over? Who gets the glory?
- 4. What role does God play in starting over? What role do we play?

—[SERMON REVIEW]—

- We often learn from mistakes that matter very little, but repeat mistakes in areas matter most.
- We need to learn how to start over in a way that ensures next time won't be like last time.
- Many of us fall into believing 3 myths about starting over—myths that prevent us from starting over in a way that ensures next time won't be like last time. These myths are:
 - 1. The Experience Myth: "Experience makes me wiser."
 - Rather: Evaluated experience makes you wiser.
 - 2. The Know-Better Myth: "Now I know better, so I will do better."
 - Rather: Knowledge minus sin frees you to do better.
 - 3. The Time Myth: "Time is against me."
 - Rather: Time is your friend.
- If we can overcome these myths, and get this starting over process right, we can come out on the other side embodying the qualities of *divine destiny* and *abiding humility*.
- Next time can be better than last time, but not just because you want it to be. Rather, it can be better because you planned for it to be!

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
