-[LET'S START]-

Today's term "evangelical" can be used in many ways. How do you define "evangelical"? Do you consider yourself to be an "Evangelical Christian"? Why or why not?

-[LET'S TALK]-

- 1. Have someone read aloud Matthew 4:19-20. What does it mean to be or become a sincere follower of Jesus?
- 2. In the passage you read Jesus said, "Come, follow me and I will make you fishers of people."
 The dictionary defines "disciple" as one who accepts and assists in spreading the doctrines of another. How do we "accept and assist" in spreading the doctrine of Jesus to become fishers of people?
- 3. Have you ever heard someone say, "My Jesus would never do that..."? Do we get to choose what Jesus is like or what He will do? Explain.
- 4. Jesus has called us to repentance. What does it really mean to repent? Pastor Dale mentioned in his message that repentance is only one side of the coin and the other side is faith. What did he mean by that?

-[LET'S ACT]-

Pastor Dale said a disciple of Jesus is someone who is actively following Jesus, is being changed by Jesus, and is on mission with Jesus. During this upcoming week, write out:

- 1. How you have been actively following Jesus.
- 2. How Jesus has been changing your life.
- 3. How you have been on mission with Jesus.
