DOCTRINE OF END TIMES – "The End of History as We Know it"

Today's lesson will focus on four key components about the end times: what, how, when, and where.

	Definitions <sup>1</sup>				
Heaven	<ol> <li>The <u>dwelling place of God</u> and those closely associated with him.</li> <li>The physical atmosphere, sun, moon, stars etc.</li> </ol>				
Eschataology	The study of end times or last things – from the word eschaton				
Paradise	Its original meaning is of a <u>beautiful garden</u> in which there is enough of everything—the perfect place. It is used to describe Eden and the New Heaven & Earth. This term is also used to describe the dwelling of believers with God before Jesus return.				
Shalom	The <u>Hebrew word for peace</u> , it root meaning denotes wholeness or completeness. It's when everything is relationally perfect between an individual and himself; an individual with God, an individual with others and an individual with creation.				
Kingdom of God	The rule and reign of God. Today it exists in Heaven and imperfectly within the lives of individual believers and the Church collectively. Following Christ's return the Kingdom of God will perfectly include all of Heaven and earth.				
Hell	The place of the <u>unbelieving dead, Satan, and his angels</u> (demons).  God and all of his good gifts will not be present in Hell. It is also called  Hades, the <u>Lake of Fire</u> .				
Judgment	<u>All</u> will stand before Jesus as judge. The righteous ( <u>believers</u> ) will receive rewards and go to <u>Heaven</u> ; the unrighteous ( <u>unbelievers</u> ) will be sent to <u>hell</u> .				
Human History	The period of time between the Fall and the Christ's return (The New Heaven & New Earth is established)				
Millennium	The <u>thousand-year</u> reign of Christ on earth. Some biblical scholars believe it is an actual 1000 years and some believe it is symbolic.				
Second Coming	Christ's <u>return to earth</u> for His people.


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#### **WHAT & WHERE**

**Question**: Let's do a little review. When God created the heavens and the earth, where did Adam & Eve live and what was life like for them?

#### A. Before the Fall


- 1. Adam & Eve lived in a <u>beautiful Garden</u> which supplied everything they needed.
- 2. They lived with <u>God</u>—they could walk and talk with him. Heaven and earth were one. We call this <u>Paradise</u>—the perfect place to live.
- 3. They lived at <u>peace</u> with each other, with God and with creation. We call this Shalom—the perfect way to live.



Question: What happened to Adam & Eve that changed their lives forever?

## B. After the Fall

- 1. Adam and Eve were <u>ashamed</u> and <u>afraid</u> to be seen by God; they <u>blamed</u> each other, then the snake. Shalom was destroyed
- 2. They were <u>cast out</u> of the Garden—out of Paradise. Earth and humans became separated from God. Satan invaded Earth and became its *ruler*
- 3. Adam, Eve and all their descendants became sinners.



C. This situation grieved God. His plan is different. **Read Revelation 22:12-23 & John 14:1-4)** 

The goal as we see in Revelation is to get back the concept of Eden yet in a more beautiful and profound way; a New creation complete with the glorious city of God. So, how do we get to this perfect place of Shalom & Eden?

God has a wonderful Plan to get people back to Paradise with him: The Plan is Jesus!

But when the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship. (Galatians 4:4-5)

#### **HOW**

- God invades <u>Satan's territory</u> by sending <u>Jesus</u> who declared that God's Kingdom had come. Mark 1:14-15 Jesus went into Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God. "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!"
- 2. Jesus innagurates His Kingdom
  - a. He recruited <u>disciples</u> Definition of a disciple: <u>Someone who is following</u> <u>Jeses, and being changed by Jesus.</u>
  - b. He told them to go and make <u>more disciples</u>
    Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surelyl am with you always, to the very end of the age. (Matthew 28:19-20)
  - c. Jesus army of disciples are the Church; it is us.
  - d. Jesus tell them (and us) that they will face <u>persecution</u>; they will experience <u>tribulation</u>; and they will encounter <u>false teaching</u> (antichrists) "Watch out that no one deceives you. For many will come in my name, claiming, 'I am the Messiah,' and will deceive many. You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things

must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains. "Then you will be handed over to be persecuted and put to death, and you will be hated by all nations because of me. At that time many will turn away from the faith and will betray and hate each other, and many false prophets will appear and deceive many people. Because of the increase of wickedness, the love of most will grow cold, 13 but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved. (Matthew 24:4-13)


- e. They (we) will be <u>successful</u>
  Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father. (John 14:12); And this gospel of the Kingdom will be preached in the whole world... (Matthew 24:14)
- f. He will send the <u>Holy Spirit</u> to help us And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate to help you and be with you forever. (John 14:16)
- 3. When God the Father decides, Jesus Declares *it is done*. He declares his victory and he comes to earth as a reigning king (1 Thessalonians 5:1-11).
  - a. Suddenly (1 Thess 5:2)
  - b. With those gone before (dead) (1 Thess 4:24)
  - c. We will meet Him in the air (1 Thess 4:17)
  - d. All will be transformed (1 Cor 15)
- D. <u>God Wins:</u> New (Renewed) Heaven and Renewed) Earth (Isaiah 11:6-9; Isaiah 35:4-10; Revelation 21:1; Revelation 22:1-6) (We will read this scripture.)

# E. Two big questions:

1. When will Jesus return?

Answer: We <u>do not know</u> and anyone who says they do is <u>wrong</u>. "But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Matthew 24:36)

But we know that <u>four</u> things that will happen before Christ returns

- a. <u>Gospel preached to the World And this gospel of the kingdom will be</u> preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and then the end will come. (Mt. 24:14)
- b. Persecution
- c. Tribulation (John 16:33)
- d. False Teaching
- 2. What will the transition look like? What actually will happen; and, will it happen over time or all at once? It is important to note that there are items about which sincere, godly biblical scholars disagree. To put it bluntly the Bible gives some very clear answers and leaves some matters to interpretation.
  - a. What we know:
    - 1. Jesus will return to earth.

"Look, he is coming with the clouds," and "every eye will see him, even those who pierced him"; and all peoples on earth "will mourn because of him." So shall it be! Amen. (Rev. 1:7)

- a. It will be physical.
- b. It will be visible (to all).
- c. It will be triumphant and glorious.
- 2. Christ followers will be given <u>a new resurrection body</u> (like Jesus after his resurrection)

So will it be with the resurrection of the dead. The body that is sown is perishable, it is raised imperishable; <sup>43</sup> it is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory; it is sown in weakness, it is raised in power; <sup>44</sup> it is sown a natural body, it is raised a spiritual body. (1 Corinthians 15:42-44)

- a. Less limited by <u>time</u> and <u>space</u>
- b. Free from death, sickness, decay
- c. Our <u>character</u> will be like that of Jesus: committed to <u>obeying</u> & <u>following</u> Jesus, <u>loving</u> our <u>neighbor</u> as ourselves; no desire to <u>sin</u> nor <u>vulnerability</u> to temptation.
- 3. Judgement: And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books. The sea gave up the dead that were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead that were in them, and each person was judged according to what they had done. Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. (Rev. 20:12-13)
  - a. <u>Christ followers</u> will be given <u>rewards</u> (crowns) and ushered into heaven.
  - b. Those who are <u>not Christ followers</u> will be sent to <u>hell</u>.
  - c. <u>Satan</u> and his <u>angels</u> (demons) will be cast into <u>hell</u>.
- b. What is in question? The timing and sequencing of events associated with Jesus' return.
  - 1. <u>Amillennialism</u> A view suggesting the thousand year reign of Christ should be interpreted metaphorically.
  - 2. <u>Millennialism</u>: Views about the "thousand year reign" of Christ that will end the present age.
    - a. <u>Premillennialism</u>: The belief that Jesus will return prior to the one thousand year reign.
    - b. **Postmillennialism**: the View that Jesus will return after the thousand year reign.
- F. **Summary**: Jesus will come again and usher in Paradise or the New Eden. Sadly, not all will be part of that; thus, our call to honor God by making more disciples for Jesus Christ.

# Commentary

The Bible teaches us that Christ is going to return. We do not know when. The Bible uses words such as "soon", but how that translates into time increments is a debate for the theologians. Consider, however, the book of Revelation was written approximately 1800-1850 years ago.

When Christ does return, he will come to judge mankind, both Christian and non-Christian. Christians will not be judged to determine their salvation. They will be judged for the quality of their actions after becoming Christians. This is judgment based on works and can be seen in Christ's teachings (Matthew 16:27) as well as the Apostle Paul's teaching (Romans 2:6).

What does this mean for us? It means that we cannot just float through life without any major changed in our lifestyles. It means that God expects us to be productive, growing Christians. He will judge us. He will hold us accountable for the time he has allotted us here on earth. We need to work on becoming mature Christians, become involved in Christian service, and be "Good Samaritans." At times, this may be difficult and costly. However, God promises to reward us according to what we have done.

Verse 13 is, basically, a description of Christ's credentials. Christ says, "I will judge you! But that is my right, for I have always been and always will be!" Therefore, he knows all, including everything we do!
